RESOLUTION OF THE MONROE COUNTY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING
THE TRANSFER OF ONE (1) PARCEL IN RARITY BAY ACQUIRED THROUGH
THE TAX SALE TO RARITY BAY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INC., AS
DESIGNEES FOR RARITY BAY PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION

- WHEREAS: One (1) tract of unimproved real property located in the Rarity Bay Community and more particularly identified as Lot 1111, Tax Parcel 019E C 015.00, owned by Suzanne Parker and Judith Woods, was included in the Delinquent Tax Lawsuit (the "Property"), was acquired by Monroe County, Tennessee (the "County") at a property tax sale conducted on February 13, 2020, confirmed by Order entered in the Chancery Court for Monroe County, Tennessee in Case Nos. 17,574; 18,004; and 18,468 on March 5, 2020 (the "Tax Sale"); and
- WHEREAS: T.C.A. §67-5-2516 et seq. provides that at any time during its ownership of the property, the tax entity (e.g., the County) may transfer such property to a non-governmental entity claiming contractual rights to the payment of fees or assessments duly recorded in covenants and restrictions; and
- WHEREAS: Rarity Bay Community Association, Inc., a Tennessee non-profit corporation, ("RBCAI"), is a non-governmental entity claiming contractual rights to the payment of fees and assessments as authorized by and pursuant to its recorded Master Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions that encumbers the Property; and
- WHEREAS: The County and RBCAI have negotiated a settlement regarding the fees and assessments as authorized pursuant to T.C.A. §67-5-2516(b) whereby RBCAI has agreed to accept the transfer of title to all the Property acquired by the County at the Tax Sale; and
- WHEREAS: The County and RBCAI have agreed to relieve any claim for taxes and/or fees assessed by either the County or RBCAI against the other; and
- WHEREAS: As authorized by T.C.A. §67-5-2516 et seq., the County Commission has voted to approve the transfer of the Property to RBCAI.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Monroe County Commissioners, assembled in regular session on the 22nd day of November 2022 that in accordance with the provisions of T.C.A. §67-5-2516 et seq., the sale by the County of Lot 1111 in the Rarity Bay Community to RBCAI, as a credit against any and all RBCAI assessments, is hereby ratified and approved, and the Monroe County Mayor is hereby authorized and directed at such time to promptly execute and deliver the necessary deed and/or another instrument (s) to effectuate the transfer and conveyance of Lot 1111 to RBCAI.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AN AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION #708-1, RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PRE-HOSPITAL MEDICAL SERVICE

WHEREAS: On the 8th day of July, 2010 a Resolution was passed approving the authorization requirements for the operation of ground or air ambulance treatment and transport services by Monroe County EMS, which resolution sets out in Section X: Local Vehicle Regulations, Subsection K provides that "Ambulance chassis shall be no more than ten (10) years old from the date of new sale or have no more than two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) miles on the odometer, except for established and dedicated backup units."; and

WHEREAS: It now appears that it would be in the best interests of Monroe County and Monroe County EMS that that requirement be amended to reflect current circumstances and requirements; and

WHEREAS: It is in the best interests of Monroe County EMS, Monroe County and all of the citizens thereof to amend Resolution #708-1, which is the Resolution Authorizing Pre-Hospital Medical Service, by substituting the language in Section X: Local Vehicle Regulations, Subsection K to provide as follows, All in service chassis must comply with state regulations for inspections."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Monroe County Commission that Resolution No. 708-1, Resolution Authorizing Pre-Hospital Medical Service shall be amended to provide that all in service ambulance chassis must comply with state regulations for inspections.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A MULTIPLE-YEAR LEASE PURCHASE and MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR THE MONROE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Health Department has need to enter into a monthly lease for a US Postage Meter, and

WHEREAS, the current postage meter is not sufficiently meeting the needs of the department in concern, and

WHEREAS, the proceeds for a multi-year lease agreement are currently budgeted within the Monroe County Health Department Budget as deemed necessary in order to expedite the resolution of this matter, and

WHEREAS, the projected cost of the postage meter and cartridges is such that the payments need to be spread over more than one budget year, and the Monroe County Director of Finance does not have the authority to enter into purchase contracts for this period of time without the approval of the Monroe County Board of Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Monroe County Board of Commissioners that the Monroe County Director of Finance be authorized to enter into a multi-year lease agreement with Pitney Bowes and the lease is not to extend over a period of more than sixty (60) months.
