RESOLUTION OF THE MONROE COUNTY COMMISSION REAFFIRMING PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED RESOLUTION NO. 0528-8

- WHEREAS: In light of recent events and statements made by the Tennessee Governor and State representatives pertaining to firearms, it is the desire of the Monroe County Commission to reaffirm their support of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and to protect law-abiding citizens right to keep and bear arms; and
- WHEREAS: On, May 28, 2019, the Monroe County Commission adopted Resolution Number 0528-8 to declare their support as a "Second Amendment Sanctuary County", meaning that Monroe County, Tennessee, will provide a safe haven and protect the United States Constitution and the Second Amendment Rights of law-abiding Monroe County citizens; and
- WHEREAS: The Tennessee State Constitution, Article 1, Section 26, states, "That the citizens of this state have a right to keep and to bear arms for their common defenses; but the Legislature shall have power, by law, to regulate the wearing of arms with a view to prevent crime."; and
- WHEREAS: The Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, adopted in 1791 as part of the Bill of Rights, protects the inalienable and individual right of the people to keep and bear arms; and
- WHEREAS: The United States Supreme Court in *District of Columbia v. Heller*, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), affirmed an individual's right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a militia, for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home; and
- WHEREAS: The United States Supreme Court in *McDonald v. Chicago*, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed that the right of an individual to "keep and bear arms", as protected under the Second Amendment, is incorporated by the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment against the states; and
- WHEREAS: The United States Supreme Court in *United States v. Miller*, 307 U.S. 174 (1939) opined that firearms that are part of ordinary military equipment, or with use that could contribute to the common defenses are protected by the Second Amendment; and
- WHEREAS: "Red Flag" laws are a violation of the Second and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution, as well as subjecting citizens to ex parte hearings; and
- WHEREAS: The Commissioners of the Monroe County Commission each swore an oath to support and protect the United States Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Monroe County Commission hereby reaffirms their declaration that Monroe County, Tennessee, shall remain a "Second Amendment Sanctuary County", meaning that Monroe County, Tennessee, shall continue to provide a safe haven and protect the United States Constitution and the Second Amendment Rights of law-abiding Monroe County citizens.
