A RESOLUTION approving the first distribution from Opioid Settlement Funds received from the State of Tennessee for the purpose of addressing the opioid crisis in Monroe County

WHEREAS, the opioid crisis has gripped our county, state, and nation, claimed many lives, devastated families, and absorbed millions of dollars in resources over the last several years, and

WHEREAS, many pharmaceutical companies have been found liable for their role in perpetuating conditions that contributed to the opioid crisis across the country, and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice (USDOJ) has reached settlements or has won judgments in cases against pharmaceutical companies found liable for their role in the opioid crisis, and

WHEREAS, the USDOJ has distributed the funds received from said judgments and settlements to state governments throughout the country, and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee has formed the Opioid Abatement Council to ensure the appropriate distribution of settlement funds received from USDOJ and establish guidelines for county recipients to remain compliant with federal requirements, and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Commission authorized the County Executive to appoint a Monroe County Opioid Settlement Fund Advisory Committee (Opioid Council), and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Executive appointed professionals and officials throughout Monroe County and the broader region to serve on the Opioid Council to ultimately provide a recommendation to the County Commission for the best use of settlement funds to positively impact the opioid crisis in Monroe County, and

WHEREAS, settlement funds have been received and will continue to be received for at least the next 18 years, and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Council does hereby recommend the following expenditures of settlement funds to address critical community health needs related to the opioid crisis:
