RESOLUTION SETTING THE TAX LEVY IN MONROE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2025, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2026

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Monroe County, Tennessee, assembled in regular session on the 24th day of June 2025 that the uniform tax rate for Monroe County, Tennessee, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, shall be **\$1.5228** on each \$100.00 of taxable property county-wide. The Federal Projects Fund operates with a cash deficit at various times throughout the fiscal year due to a slow turnaround time for reimbursements from the State of Tennessee. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) consider a cash deficit in any fund to be a significant deficiency in internal control and Monroe County does not desire to operate any fund with a cash deficit.



2. That said funds must only be spent by the named nonprofit charitable organizations in furtherance of their nonprofit charitable purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Monroe County.
3. That it is the expressed interest of the County Commission of Monroe County in providing these funds to the above-named nonprofit charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0380-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-9-109, Tennessee Code Annotated and any and all other laws which may apply to county organizations and to nonprofit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.

Resolution No. 0624-11

A Resolution of the Monroe County Commission Abandoning a Portion of Edwards Road and Converting it to a Public Road with Specified Right-of-Way

WHEREAS, the County of Monroe currently maintains Edwards Road up to a certain point, hereinafter referred to as the "Maintenance End Point"; and

WHEREAS, Edwards Road extends beyond the Maintenance End Point to the boundary of lands managed by the United States Forest Service, hereinafter referred to as the "Forest Service Boundary"; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to abandon its jurisdiction and maintenance responsibility for the portion of Edwards Road between the Maintenance End Point and the Forest Service Boundary, hereinafter referred to as the "Abandoned Segment"; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to ensure continued public access to properties adjoining the Abandoned Segment; and

WHEREAS, the County finds that converting the Abandoned Segment to a public road with a specified right-of-way width will serve the public interest;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the County of Monroe as follows:

1. The County hereby abandons its jurisdiction and maintenance responsibility for the Abandoned Segment of Edwards Road.
2. The Abandoned Segment is hereby designated as a public road, with a right-of-way width of thirty (30) feet, allowing access to all properties which adjoin it.
3. The County shall continue to maintain only that portion of Edwards Road up to the Maintenance End Point.
4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
